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Board Minutes Summary - January 27, 2015

Manager's Report

The well project is progressing and will be evaluated for approximately three months to determine reliability. Over the next 3 months Porter will be working on funding options for our road project.

President's Report

The work of the well distribution system is in full swing. The board is in the process of consolidating committees and working to refine their duties and responsibilities. A tree and lighting committee is being established.

Chief Financial Officer's Report

No report. Slatinsky reported Soto is working on ways to cut administrative costs.

Committee Reports

Architectural – The committee is in need of an architectural chairperson.

Governing Documents – The chair is in process of reviewing the Association's governing documents.

Landscaping – The slope above the tennis courts and behind the raised solar panels is being started soon. Orange flags are being placed to mark recent gopher activity. Walls which need to be repainted are being identified.

Water Usage – Jim reported water usage is the same as last year. He noted the irrigation retrofit should change this in the near future.

RV Storage – The storage units are all rented and there are a few small RV spots available.

Old Business

Fire Alarm Status – The project is completed and we are online.

LED Clubhouse Lighting status - The lights inside the clubhouse and the light fixtures outside the clubhouse, except the globes on the north side, have been replaced.

Well Status – Jim Hook is monitoring the project on a daily basis. Everything is moving as expected and should be complete in a couple of weeks. The Well Committee worked with Tri County and was able to reduce original costs by approximately \$6,300. The HOA received a permit from the county for an electric meter. Slatinsky thanked Jim Hook and Casey Myers for their efforts on this project.

Pacific Green – Walk throughs continue and irrigation retrofit is almost complete.

Valve Replacement Status – The valve was replaced with help from owner Bob Massey.

New Year's Eve Report – The party expenses totaled \$1,838.82 Receipts for the party totaled \$1,290.00. This is a net cost to the association of \$548.82. A special thanks was given to Carol and Greg Shue for organizing and coordinating the party.

New Business

Intruder Alarm – The Board agreed to install a security alarm for the office.

Tree Trimming – Landscape Committee developed a list of trees to be addressed. AG Pest will inspect trees for a mite infestation.

Welcoming Committee - Lydia Houghton volunteered to establish a Welcoming Committee for new owners.
