President's Message

Last month I announced we hired a road consultant. This month the Road Committee met with consultant, Monty Wilde, to review his findings and recommendations. He recommended we repair all the roads in one project. The calculated cost is \$847,289. This figure includes the RV Lot and is below the first projected \$ 1.2 million dollar calculation. Bids could come in lower than projected. The Board voted to retain Monty to develop our specifications; release and collect the bids; and be our inspector for the entire project. The HOA is currently able to fund 50% of the total cost. Options to fund the remaining 50% are being explored. We will know more when the bids are received. Our goal is to have the road project completed by December. This is very exciting news for the project.

The Board's goal is NOT to increase homeowner dues or to levy a one-time assessment.

Casey is developing a plan to control erosion. It includes adding waddles, replanting some barren areas, and investigating the feasibility of hydro seeding eroded banks. Pacific Green is working with Casey to improve grass area irrigation to reduce browning.

The Board reviewed the HOA's Reserve Analysis. It reflects a promising financial forecast for Crown Hills. We are currently developing next year's budget.

Candidates for the Board are Kathy Santangelo, Robert Soto, Mike Wilmers, and Tito Cruz. Read their bios in this newsletter. I encourage everyone to complete your ballot and drop them by the office before September 18th. Your vote counts!

As this month comes to a close, I am very excited with the progress our Board has made in getting the road project underway. A special "Thank You" goes to the road committee for their valuable input. Our children will be returning to school. Please use caution and be extra alert while driving within Crown Hills.

Grab and Go Boxes (pg. 18) These boxes should contain copies of all your important documents such as insurance policies, birth certificates, charge card numbers, social security cards, electronic files, personal finance records, telephone and address books, tax records, vaccination records, and a video tape of your homes contents. These items will help facilitate the insurance adjuster's loss report in the event of a property loss.

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Board Minutes Summary - August 25, 2015

Financial Report

The Board reviewed the Financial Report for period ending 7/31/2015. The Operating Account balance is \$10,827.09, the Reserve Account balance is \$861,183.09 and the Accounts Receivable balance is \$8,446.57. Pre-paid Income totaled \$24,130.46 for this period. Monthly Income for this period was \$62,143.00 with expenses of \$37,761.00 for a net of \$6,648. When factoring in the cost of the well, the Association is approximately \$31,301 under budget year to date. Motion was carried to approve the Financial Report as presented pending independent financial audit.

The Board and the Community Manager reviewed a draft of the 2015 Reserve Study prepared by Barrera and Company in great detail. The Reserve Study draft currently shows the Association's Reserve/Savings to be approximately 53% by the end of the current fiscal year but may change with the amendments. This item has been tabled for approval to the next scheduled board meeting.

Presidents Report

- Erosion Plan Includes straw waddles, installing ground cover and possibly hydro seeding some areas. Pacific Green is working with Casey Myers to improve irrigation efficiency to the turf areas.
- The 2016 proposed budget discussions will begin with the Board of Directors and Community Manager working closely to develop the budget.

Committee Reports

Architectural

The Chair of the Committee Pat Bowles provided a brief update regarding outstanding requests and issues.

Water pressure was increased to allow higher elevations of the property more equal water coverage. A well area planting plan is being developed to be implemented as funds are available. Mulch from recent tree trimming spread through the common areas. Pam Whitefield has resigned as chair of the landscape committee. The Board thanked her for all of her time and dedication to the community.

Well Water Operations

Jim Hook provided a brief report for this period. As of 7/31/2015, the Association is approximately \$32,964 under budget for water & sewer.

Unfinished Business

Cedar Tree Treatment

Agricultural Pest Control has applied the second deep root feeding and fertilization in an attempt to save the trees. The Cedar trees seem to be improving with the treatments.

Community Asphalt Repair/Replacement

The Board is discussing funding of the project. Approximately half of the amount would be paid with current cash reserves. The remaining half would be paid through a bank loan. The loan would be paid back with funds saved on water & sewer savings. A vote of the membership will be scheduled to approve or not approve a proposed bank loan.

New Business

Pine Tree Bark Beetle Treatment

The Board reviewed a proposal from Agricultural Pest Control to treat approximately 129 trees for bark beetles for \$5,160,00. Motion carried with 3 yea, 1 nay, 1 abstention.

Larkspur Slope Planting Proposal

Pacific Green's proposal to install shrubs and straw waddles along the common sloped area on Larkspur was reviewed. Motion carried. ****
