Letter from the Board President

This has been a productive year. I am pleased to report to you, the choice of Professional HOA Consultants, Inc. as our management company has proved an excellent decision. We have accomplished more than in the past because they are "on top" of projects and follow through with them. There are still many "to do's" on our list. The Board, with assistance from PHOAC, will be addressing them. In the February newsletter we will outline the goals for 2013.

Below is the year 2012 in review:

- PHOAC hired Mary Hartig as office administrator. (FYI: hasn't missed a day of work)
- > The newsletter is now being produced by PHOAC.
- PHOAC initiated four ways to pay fees and provided access to your account online.
- > Spending authority streamlined to ensure expenses can be dealt with promptly.
- > Trash Service fee reduction was initiated.
- > RV bin price was reduced approximately two thirds.
- > A new security camera system was installed
- > Wi-Fi set up for the clubhouse area.
- > Décor, paint, and new furniture in clubhouse completed.
- > A new treadmill and slightly used elliptical machine were purchased.
- > Approved a new exercise equipment maintenance program.
 - > Electrical repairs were made in the exercise room.
 - Electrical Repairs: Air-conditioners, outlets, alarm system, and replaced main panel.
 - > Stair railings were painted and repaired.
 - > The monument sign was painted.
 - > Painted clubhouse parking lot spaces/curbs and stop sign markers.
 - > New house colors and stone veneers were approved.
 - Pacific Green handled erosion control lots 110-115, grass removal and mulch on Gentian, brush abatement and slope stabilization
 - Three new doggie stations were purchased and installed gratis by Pacific Green.
 - > Monument sign and clubhouse landscape renovations were completed.
 - > Additional drainage ditch repairs were made.
 - > Per Padre Dam requirements installed backflow and cover.
 - Approved tree trimming contracts.
 - > Pest Control for all common areas initiated.
 - > Architectural rule amendments were approved.
 - > Crown Hill HOA rules changes were approved.

RV Lot Trash Bin - Not For Homeowner Use

If personal waste is left by the RV lot trash bin, the HOA is charged an additional fee for disposal. This includes refuse from people who rent RV spaces and storage lockers. When cleaning out a storage locker or an RV vehicle, **do not** dispose of your personal waste in the HOA Waste Management trash bin – take it home! It is a violation to leave your waste for the HOA to dispose of. Anyone found doing this risks being fined. Allied Waste will pick up 2 large items twice a year at no charge to the homeowner. Call them for an appointment.

Helpful Hints

Use a timer for some of your indoor lights or get a motion sensor for outdoor lights.
