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Board Minutes Summary - January 26, 2015

Open Forum

New home owners were welcomed and discussed the idea of a Community playground. There was concern over guest parking continually being used by residents vehicles.

Chief Financial Officer's Report

The Board reviewed the Financial Report for period ending 12/31/2015. The Operating Account balance is \$79,868.52, the Reserve Account balance is \$872,914.43 and the Accounts Receivable balance is \$9,758.63. Pre -paid Income totaled \$25,866.56. Monthly Income was \$60,546.00 with expenses of \$43,658.00 for a net of \$14,244.00 with most of this attributed to water savings. Total assets as of 12/31/2015 is \$934,747.00. A motion was made, seconded and carried to approve the Financial Report as presented for filing pending independent financial audit.

Committee Reports

Architectural - Pat Bowles reported on amount of received and approved forms since 11/24/15

Landscaping – Committee provided a draft charter and procedures along with long term goals for the board to review. Pacific Green and Candace are now conducting monthly walkthroughs and providing reports of problem areas.

Well Water Usage - The well was off most of December due to periods of rain events.

Unfinished Business

Trash and Recycle Consolidation Update - Service begins on February 3rd with bins being delivered on February 1st. Republic Service has committed to start replacing bins with Allied Waste or Pacific on the bins to create a more uniform appearance in the community.

Community Asphalt Repair/Replacement Update - A bank loan of \$250,000 has been approved and will be paid back in five (5) years at approximately \$4,755 per month to fund a portion of the proposed asphalt repair/replace project. The project is expected to begin mid to late April, depending on weather conditions.
 Parking Lot Solar Lighting Proposals - Rejected but will seek standard light poles pending funding review.
 Monitoring Camera System - Tabled pending funding review.

New Business

Clubhouse Flooring Replacement – Tabled pending funding review.

2016 Reserve Expenditure Review – The Board reviewed the recommended component replacements for 2016 per the recently completed reserve study. Each item will be inspected to determine if replacement is needed. Replacement will be scheduled as needed.

The ARC has up to 60 days to respond with a decision on all requests. Starting work prior to being approved can result in fines.
